HCS Announces the Class Leaders of 2014



Highest Academic Award – Byron Evans, son of Timothy Evans, Harrisville, NY and Marylou Corbine, Black River, NY has earned the highest academic award, Valedictorian, for the Class of 2014. Byron plans to attend LeMoyne College and major in biology so that he can eventually pursue a career as a physician's assistant. Byron's seven semester academic average is 95.75. Byron will earn Advanced Placement credits in United States History and English Literature & Composition. At graduation in June Byron will receive an Advanced Designation Regents Diploma with honors; mastery in math and science.

Throughout high school, Bryon's sports activities have included JV and Varsity Boys soccer, basketball and baseball. Byron was a member of National Junior Honor Society and is a current member of National Honor Society where he serves as Treasurer this year. 





SENIOR CLASS 2014: BEST WISHES!

Mrs. Tyler and Mrs. Chartrand would like to congratulate the graduating Class of 2014! The guidance office wishes every student the best as they go on to pursue higher education, a military assignment or a job in the workforce. Please stay in contact with us and let us know how you're doing!

<u>GUIDANCE RECORDS</u> – Class of 2008: We only keep guidance records for six years. That means we will be destroying guidance records from the class of 2008 in June of this year. (NOTE: we still keep a transcript.) Any member of that class is welcome to call before June 30, 2014 to have his or her folder as a keepsake.

<u>IMMUNIZATION RECORDS</u> – Class of 2004: Harrisville Central School keeps immunization records for 10 years. We will be destroying immunization records from the class of 2004 at the end of June this year. Any member of that class is welcome to call Mrs. Chartrand, 543-2920, to obtain their immunization record. Requests for immunization records must be made **PRIOR TO June 30, 2014**.

<u>ATTENDANCE/EXCUSES</u> - There are many students in grades Pre-K-12 who owe excuses for days they were either absent or tardy from school. Please send in these excuses as soon as possible, as the school is required by NYS law to keep them on file to validate whether or not absences are excused or unexcused.

<u>PERFECT ATTENDANCE</u> – Middle school & high school students will be awarded a Perfect Attendance Certificate only if they have been in attendance daily for the full day with no absences, tardiness or early dismissals.

<u>FINAL REPORT CARDS</u> - The final report cards for grades 6-12 will be sent home <u>during the week of June 30th</u> - <u>July 3rd</u>. NOTE: If your son or daughter has any outstanding obligations such as: lunch charges, library books, textbooks, excuses, etc., the final report cards will <u>not</u> be mailed home, but held in the main office until all obligations are met.

<u>COURSE FAIL LETTERS</u> – Letters will be mailed home on a rolling basis as the guidance office is notified of course failures. Please call the guidance office if you have questions about the option of summer school.

HONOR ROLL:

To qualify for the **High Honor Roll**, a student must have an average of 90.0 or above in all academic subjects and have passed all courses during that report period with no incompletes.

To qualify for **Honor Roll**, a student must have an average of at least 85.0, but below 90.0, and have passed all courses taken during that report period with no incompletes.

A failing grade in physical education will cause the student to be ineligible for the Honor/High Honor Roll. Honor roll eligibility depends on the marking period (term) grade, not the examination grade.

<u>SUMMER SCHOOL</u> - Any student in grades 9-12 who fails a required course should consider attending summer school this summer. Because of graduation requirements, it is extremely difficult to avoid scheduling conflicts, an overload of classes or an additional year of high school if you do not go to summer school for a failed course. The policy at HCS is as follows:

A student must have passed two quarters of work in Harrisville <u>and</u> the summer session **OR** attain an average grade that is passing when two thirds of the Harrisville's final grade is averaged with one third of the summer school grade.

The guidance office at HCS will handle summer school registration for students who would like to take a course at either Gouverneur Regional Summer School or Carthage Central Secondary Summer School. Specific information about summer school registration and deadlines will be posted on the school website and outside the guidance office on the bulletin board. Students may also pick up information in the guidance office.


** THERE WILL BE NO SUMMER SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED TO EITHER LOCATION**





The Bean Project Continued (First Story Printed in October)

Harlee Cook and Mackenzie Woodward, both from Mr. Hebert's fourth grade class, were able to keep the bean plants alive throughout the year. This was really a challenge sometimes. The plants faced a December power-outage that caused them to partially freeze. They also went home with students over our break in February and survived. After planting the beans, the class really got excited about growing plants from seeds. They have germinated pomegranates, an apple seed, and sunflowers to name a few. Last month, the Fourth and First grade classes went to Mr. Hebert's family greenhouses and gardens. While there, students plant-

ed seeds in the garden and worked in the greenhouse. They also learned about our some of our local tree varieties, and the effects of erosion.

The bean plants produced earlier this year, and the class thought it would be a great test to attempt to harvest the beans, dry them, and then replant them. The girls were able to successfully start a new generation of bean plants from the seeds they collected. The beans, pomegranates, and apple seedling are all growing nicely.




