Phillip plans to attend Rochester Institute of Technology in the fall to major in physics. Phillip aspires to become an astrophysicist.

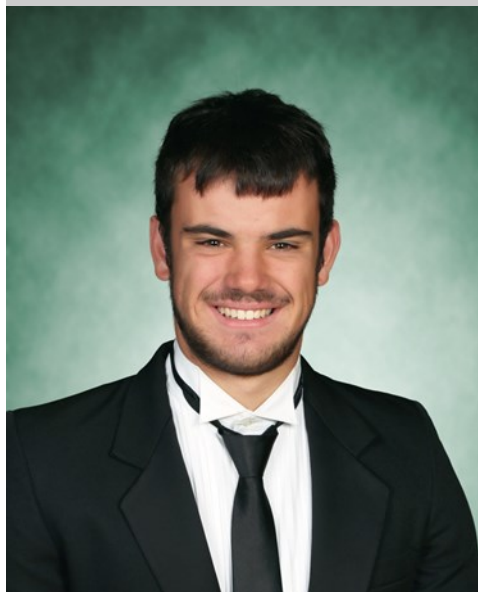
At graduation in June, Phillip will receive a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation with Honors and Mastery in Math and Science. Phillip's seven semester academic average is 96.2. Phillip will earn advanced placement credits in United States History. He will have dual enrollment credits through North Country

Community College in U.S. History, Pre-calculus and English 12 and through SUNY Potsdam in French IV. Phillip also has earned college credits in psychology through Hudson Valley Community College distance learning.

Phillip's favorite extracurricular activity is American Kang Duk Won Karate. He has been involved in karate for over 10 years and is dedicated to the art. Phillip is currently a brown belt. He has also worked with his instructors to assist when teaching younger students. Many young students look up to Phillip as he encourages them to continue with their own martial arts experiences.

Peyton's academic grade point average for seven semesters is 93.4 and he will receive an Advanced Designation Regents Diploma at graduation in June.

Peyton plans to study environmental studies and/or biology at St. Lawrence University in the fall. His ideal careers would include a wildlife biologist or an environmental conservation officer. Peyton will earn advanced placement credits in United States History and Calculus AB. He will receive dual enrollment credits through North Country Community College in English

12, Pre-Calculus, and US History. He will also receive dual enrollment credits through SUNY Potsdam for French IV.

Peyton has been active in many school groups and sports. He is a former member of the National Junior Honor Society and a current member of National Honor Society. As a freshman, Peyton was a member of the high school chorus. For his junior and senior years, he was a member of the Student Representative Assembly. Freshman year, Peyton played JV soccer and then spent the next three fall seasons playing Varsity football with Gouverneur High School, earning the position of captain senior year and was awarded the Don Petty Memorial Award. ## Guidance Office News

**SUMMER SCHOOL** - Any student in grades 9-12 who fails a required course should consider attending summer school this summer. Because of graduation requirements, it is extremely difficult to avoid scheduling conflicts, an overload of classes or an additional year of high school if you do not go to summer school for a failed course. The policy at HCS is as follows:

*A student must have passed two quarters of work in Harrisville **and** the summer session **OR** attain an average grade that is passing when two thirds of the Harrisville's final grade is averaged with one third of the summer school grade.*

The guidance office at HCS will handle summer school registration for students who would like to take a course at HCS or at either Gouverneur Regional Summer School or Carthage Central Secondary Summer School. Specific information about summer school registration and deadlines will be posted on the school website and outside the guidance office on the bulletin board. Students may also pick up information in the guidance office.

**\*\* THERE WILL BE NO SUMMER SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED TO EITHER the  
GOUVERNEUR or CARTHAGE LOCATION\*\***

**Students are responsible for arranging their own transportation.**

- Students must register, with Mrs. Carr, to retake a Regents exam in August, by July 5, 2019. Students are charged a fee for Regents exams in August (\$40 for Gouverneur or \$30 for Carthage). August Regents are held Tuesday, August 13, 2019 and Wednesday, August 14, 2019.
- Harrisville Central School will offer credit recovery for students in grades 9-12 for English, math and social studies from July 22, 2019 to August 12, 2019. To register, students need to see Mrs. Carr by July 5, 2019.
- To register for summer school in Gouverneur Central School, students need to see Mrs. Carr by July 3, 2019.
- To register for summer school in Carthage Central School, students need to see Mrs. Carr by June 21, 2019 (English 9 or 10, Global 9, Spanish 1, CFM) or July 5, 2019 (English 11 or 12, Global 10, US History, Algebra 1 or 2, Geometry, Living Environment, Earth Science, Chemistry).
- Students are charged a fee to register for summer school courses in Gouverneur and Carthage.

**COURSE FAIL LETTERS** – Letters will be mailed home on a rolling basis as the guidance office is notified of course failures. Please call the guidance office if you have questions about the option of summer school. Notification of summer school options here at Harrisville Central will be sent with this letter.

**GUIDANCE RECORDS** – **Class of 2013:** We only keep guidance records for six years. That means we will be destroying guidance records from the class of 2013 in June of this year. (NOTE: we still keep a transcript.) **Any member of that class is welcome to call before June 28, 2019 to have his or her folder as a keepsake.**

**IMMUNIZATION RECORDS** – **Class of 2009:** Harrisville Central School keeps immunization records for 10 years. We will be destroying immunization records from the **class of 2009** at the end of June this year. Any member of that class is welcome to call Mrs. Chartrand, 315-543-2920, to obtain their immunization record. Requests for immunization records must be made **PRIOR TO June 28, 2019.**



**ATTENDANCE/EXCUSES** - There are many students in grades Pre-K-12 who owe excuses for days they were either absent or tardy from school. **Please send in these excuses as soon as possible, as the school is required by NYS law to keep them on file to validate whether or not absences are excused or unexcused.**

**PERFECT ATTENDANCE** – Middle school & high school students will be awarded a Perfect Attendance Certificate only if they have been in attendance daily for the full day with no absences, tardiness or early dismissals.

**FINAL REPORT CARDS** - The final report cards for grades 7-12 will be sent home **during the week of July 8 – July 12**. ***NOTE: If your son or daughter has any outstanding obligations such as: lunch charges, library books, textbooks, excuses, etc., the final report cards will NOT be mailed home, but held in the main office until all obligations are met.***

### **Honor Roll:**

To qualify for the **High Honor Roll**, a student must have an average of 90.0 or above in all academic subjects and have passed all courses during that report period with no incompletes.

To qualify for **Honor Roll**, a student must have an average of at least 85.0, but below 90.0, and have passed all courses taken during that report period with no incompletes.

A failing grade in physical education will cause the student to be ineligible for the Honor/High Honor Roll.

Honor roll eligibility depends on the marking period (term) grade, not the examination grade.

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## Integrated Pest Management

## American Kang Duk Won Martial Artists Earn Medals and Belt Promotions

Members of American Kang Duk Won Karate classes from several North Country classes recently participated in two major events to kick off the school's Spring 2019 training programs. Last month area students and instructors preformed in the 45<sup>th</sup> Annual International Karate Championships held at Jefferson Community College. The tournament included nearly two hundred martial artists from New York, Ohio, and Ontario. Medal winners in various belt levels (youth and adult divisions) represented classes from throughout many communities of the North Country.

On Tuesday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, twenty-four students were evaluated for belt promotions which required performances in skill levels from novice through the advanced ranks of brown belt. The formal tests were held at the East Side School in Gouverneur. Students were required to display disciplines in formal exercises (kata), free sparring, self-defense techniques, and knowledge of martial arts history. The evaluations were administered by Master Robert Lawlor, president of American Kang Duk Won Karate, and a team of eight Black Belt Instructors.

**Registrations of all new spring and summer lessons are now being held. Memberships will allow students to attend summer camps (youth June 1-2 and adults June 27-30). The summer camps offer a wide range of courses (karate, nutrition, philosophy, fitness, climbing skills, personal safety) in the rural setting of Lorraine, NY. Well, our first season of Harrisville boys' lacrosse has been completed and I wanted to take this opportunity to reflect. We started practicing on Monday, March 25<sup>th</sup> with 28 boys from 7<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades. None of these athletes had ever played a lacrosse game and most had never even seen a game be played! We started with the basics of passing and catching, picking up ground balls, shooting the ball, dodging, and checking. As their skills improved, we proceeded to teach them about the different positions and their roles, the different offenses and defenses and the rules and infractions they needed to learn before they could actually compete in a game.

On Thursday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> we played at Watertown HS against their combined JV/Varsity team, with 24 boys from Harrisville competing. For me to see the excitement in the boys' faces before and during the game made this year's coaching experience totally worth it for me. I must add how much respect and admiration I have for each and every one of these athletes who decided to take a chance and try a new sport and the time and effort they put forth in learning the very fast and technical game of lacrosse.

There were many of the players' family members, students, and former students who made the trip to watch the boys play and everyone that I have spoken with has said it was fun to watch. I would like to thank everyone for the continued support for Harrisville Lacrosse!

A big part of my coaching philosophy is that in order to build a successful lacrosse program at Harrisville, we need to start them young. 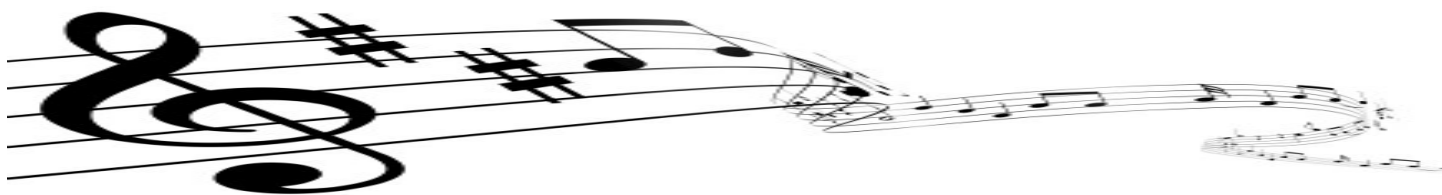

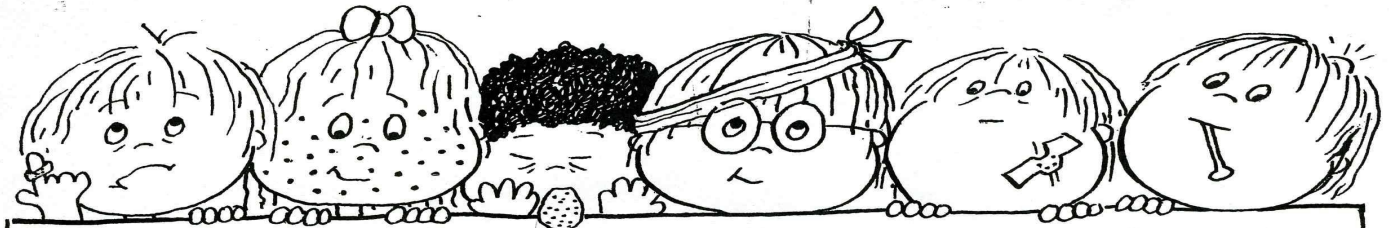

Elementary Concert: The final 5th/6th grade concert of the year will be Thursday, June 13th at 7PM. This will feature 5th grade band, 5th/6th grade chorus, and 6th grade band. New this year, 4th grade pre-band will also play, featuring students on recorders. Each student enrolled in grades Pre-K or Kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11 are mandated by State Education law to have a health examination conducted by the student's family physician, physicians assistant, or nurse practitioner. If your child will enter one of the above grades in the fall you must provide the district with a physical that was completed sometime after September 4, 2018. These physicals must be received in the health office by the end of the month of September 2019. State law also **requests** a dental health certificate on each student entering the above grades. Students entering **grade 6** in the fall must have a **Tdap** and **#2 Varicella Vaccine** prior to the second week of school. **Meningitis Vaccines** are mandated for students entering grades 7 and 12.
